Nell Painter (the painter formerly known as the historian Nell Irvin Painter, author of *The History of White People, Sojourner Truth, A Life, A Symbol,* and *Creating Black Americans* and the Edwards Professor of American History, Emerita, Princeton University) lives and works in Newark, New Jersey.
